COMMUNITY AND SCHOOL

Leilehua High School, home of the Mighty Mules, was founded in 1924 and is located in Wahiawa, Hawaii approximately 22 miles from the capital city of Honolulu. Leilehua anchors the Leilehua Complex of Schools, which consists of the high school, two middle schools, and seven elementary schools. Due to its proximity to military installations, approximately 25% of the students' families serve in the US Military. Leilehua hosts a culturally diverse student body with a population of 27% Filipino, 22% Caucasian, 18% Native Hawaiian, 9% African American, 6% Asian, 3% Hispanic, 3% Samoan, and 3% Micronesian.

Honors Recognition Certificates:

In addition to meeting the requirements for the Hawaii High School Diploma, students with a cumulative GPA of 3.0 or higher are eligible for one or more of the three Honor Recognition Certificates.

Academic Honors: Math (4 Credits), Science (4 Credits), AP/Running Start (2 Credits)

Career & Technical Education (CTE) Honors: Completes program of study (2-3 credits in sequence plus a state – identified specific academic course requirement.)

Must earn B or better in each course and meet or exceed proficiency on performance-based assessment.

STEM Honors: Math (4 Credits), Science (4 Credits), STEM Capstone or STEM Senior Project.

CURRICULUM:

Leilehua is a four-year public high school that provides students with opportunities to engage in challenging and rigorous courses through core classes, Career and Technical Education, Directed Study, Honors, Advanced Placement, Dual Credit Early College, AVID, ELL, Special Education, and Special Motivation courses. Leilehua High School is accredited by the Western Association of Schools and Colleges (WASC).

GRADING SYSTEM

Students receive letter grades and points using the 4.0 scale. Early College and Advanced Placement courses are weighted on a 5.0 scale. Cumulative GPA and Class Rank are calculated at the end of each semester.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT

Students in the 10th, 11th, and 12th grades are allowed to enroll in AP courses. This year Leilehua High School offers the following 15 courses:
